### **Program Description**

The Bachelor of Arts in Geography with a concentration in Geographic Information Science (GIScience) emphasizes student development of geospatial skills. Geographic Information Science, cartography, remote sensing, and qualitative and quantitative methods prepare students to tackle any problem with a spatial dimension—from advising an individual firm on good locations for a new branch or supplier to modeling the spread of wildfires across a region to analyzing the global spread of diseases or new technologies.

- Courses in the concentration core requirements (Geog 109, Geog 110, Geog 150, and Geog 155) must be passed with a minimum grade of Cto satisfy requirements.
