Program Description

In addition to obtaining a 2.0 in the overall 53-56 unit major, a student must achieve <u>an overall average</u> 2.5 GPA in the 40 units of required <u>CSAD</u> major <u>coursework</u> in order to graduate with a Bachelor <u>of</u> Science Degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders. In order to achieve these GPAs, students may repeat courses for which grades of C- or below were earned, contingent upon their eligibility to do so under the campus policy on repeating courses. Repeated course grades will either be forgiven or averaged with the new grade according to the campus policy on repeating courses. Students must complete the major prerequisites before beginning courses in Communication Science and Disorders.

Undergraduate courses are designed for students to begin in the fall semester and progress in a proscribed sequence.

It is strongly recommended that students:

- Take a course in physics and/or chemistry as some programs offering the Master's Degree in Speech-Language Pathology or Communication Sciences and Disorders will require it.
- Finish all Undergraduate General Education units before beginning major coursework.

- Completion of a Level 1 criminal background screening. Screenings must be conducted by the department-sanctioned agency. Refer to Department webpage for current agency instructions. Background checks performed by other agencies are not accepted.
